For the information of the Bureau, HERMAN "HANK" GREENSPUN, Publisher of the Las Vegas Sun, Daily Newspaper, is presently being sued by WILLIAM (BILL) PECCOLE, Incumbent City Commissioner, up for re-election, for libel. The libel action, in the amount of \$900.00, was filed against GREENSPUN on or about April 12, 1953, in which PECCOLE charges GREENSPUN with four counts of libel.

GREENSPUN allegedly printed charges in his newspaper on four different occasions that PECCOLE was dishonest and had used his public office for personal gain. The suit will be tried in the Eighth Judicial District Court, Las Vegas, Nevada, in Judge FRANK McNAMEE's department.

The attorneys for the plaintiff made statements published in the newspapers that they would attempt to have the case tried before the May 5, 1953, city elections.

The document furnished this office is a carbon copy, indicating the existence of other copies, and was loaned an Agent at Las Vegas by WILLIAM "BILL" FECCOLE, City Commissioner, Las Vegas, Nevada, for review. It is believed this document was furnished PECCOLE by Senator MC CARRAN'S office since the Senator is backing PECCOLE in the current city elections at Las Vegas, and GREENSPUN is opposing PECCOLE'S re-election. This document is being returned to PECCOLE as requested by him.

For the Bureau's information, according to a newspaper item in the Las Vegas "Review Journal", PECCOLE filed a \$900,000 civil libel suit against GREENSPUN for publication of alleged "false, malicious, and defamatory" statements. It was alleged that GREENSPUN editorially asserted PECCOLE was a dishonest public official guilty of corruption in his official duties during the past four years.

Also enclosed herewith for the Bureau's information is a copy of Los Angeles letter to Indianapolis, April 20, 1953, entitled, "Cominfil International Typographical Union, AF of L International Security C", which letter contains information regarding GREENSPUN and the Las Vegas "Sun".

MEMORANDUM

RE: HERMAN M. GREENSPUN

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Greenspun was born August 27, 1909, at Brooklyn, New York, the son of Samuel and Anna Greenspun. He has a brother, David Greenspun, and two married sisters, Mildred Taub and Alice Querze. He attended St. Johns College from 1930 to 1932 and St. Johns School of Law, Brooklyn, New York, receiving an LLB degree in 1934.

He was employed by Alfred Friedman Co., NYC 1924-29; LeBlang-Grays Theatre Ticket Agency, NYC, 1930-36; Pinto and Marcantonio, 20 Besey St., b6 NYC, law clerk, 1933-36; United Steel Co., NYC, 1936-38; Vulcan Steel Co., b7C NYC, 1938-41. He was inducted into the US Army 3-13-41 and transferred to ERC 10-24-41 as over 28 years of age; 1-22-42 recalled to active duty and appointed 2nd Lt. He was reported AWOL from 12-31-44 to 1-1-45 and accepted punishment under Article of War 104.

After his discharge from the Army he was employed in the law office of Benjamin C. Ribman, NYC, now deceased. Even though he is a lawyer, he has never been known to practice law.

Greenspun moved to Las Vegas, Nevada, in 1946, where he subsequently published a social news sheet, "Las Vegas Life", and at the same time worked as a publicity man at the Flamingo Hotel which was being constructed by the late underworld king, "Bugsy" Siegel. He later worked as promoter of radio station KRAM, in which he held stock, and in 1949 he was engaged in the construction and promotion of the Desert Inn, a resort hotel, both of Las Vegas, Nevada. He reportedly received no salary for the latter job, but was to receive stock in the corporation when the resort was completed.

Greenspun was employed at the Desert Inn until about July 1, 1950, when he resigned and purchased the Las Vegas Free Press, a semi-weekly Las Vegas paper. He immediately changed the name to Las Vegas Morning Sun and published this paper as a daily.

The Editor and Publisher, International Yearbook, 1951, which lists daily and Sunday newspapers, contains no listing for the Las Vegas Morning Sun or Greenspun.

The current telephone directory covering Las Vegas, Nevada, reflects the following listing: H. M. Greenspun, 315 N. Eighth Street.

Greenspun is the subject of a record which reflects his arrests in the Neutrality Act cases mentioned below as well as his registration at Las Vegas, Nevada, as an ex-convict.

Reynold Selk, who was involved in the Neutrality Act case mentioned below, is believed to be Greenspun's cousin. Greenspun's parents, Samuel and Anna were born in Poland and Russia, respectively, and both were naturalized in New Haven, Conn.

II. INVESTIGATION OF GREENSPUN UNDER NEUTRALITY ACT.

Herman Greenspun has been subject of two investigations under the Neutrality Act.

This case arose out of the efforts of the above-mentioned individuals to procure airplanes and airplane parts and accessories for shipment to the Israeli fighting forces in Palestine. Adolph Schwimmer was contacted in September, 1947. by one assertedly a representative of the Jewish Agency. furnished large sums of money to Schwimmer for the purpose of procuring airplanes to fly freight to Palestine.

This particular case cited above, in which prosecutive action was carried out at Los Angeles, Calif., was divided into four phases. Greenspun's activities were prominent in only one phase, that one concerning the attempted export of forty-two airplane engines from Los Angeles, Calif. to Panama.

Greenspun paid \$4,000 in case for labor and freight charges for the shipment to Los Angeles, Calif. On March 25, 1948, 95 crates containing 12 Pratt and Whitney R2800-10W airplane engines, arrived in Los Angeles consigned to the Universal Airplane Salvage Corporation, Los Angeles, which address was nonexistent. When an attempt was made to move this shipment of airplane engines to Panama, the shipment was signed by United States Customs Service at Los Angeles on April 14, 1948, inasmuch as it was illegal to export this type aircraft engine.

Indictments were returned by the Federal Grand Jury at Los Angeles on April 6, 1949, charging Schwimmer, Selk, Levin, Greenspun, Sosnow, Gardner and the corporation, Service Airways, with conspiracy to violate the Neutrality Act and Export Control Laws. Subjects were charged with violation of Title 22, Sections 452 and 453, 2776, dated March 26, 1948. Greenspun submitted himself for arrest, entered a plea of not guilty b70 and was released on bond of \$1,000. On February 6, 1950, in Federal Court in Los Angeles, Greenspun and and Sosnow were acquitted. Subjects Schwimmer, Selk and Gardner were found guilty of conspiracy to violate the Neutrality Act and Export Control laws. Information was received that a juror in this trial had been contacted by the defendents during the trial. It had been reported that all of the jurors except this one voted for a guilty verdict of all subjects, and a compromised verdict had been reached as a result of pressure by this juror on the rest of the jury. Subsequently, it was determined that this juror had received mental treatment in an institution prior to the beginning of the case and that he was of Semitic origin. Accordingly, no investigation was made. d city and income .B. with aliases; Herman Milton Greenspun, with aliases, et al. In March. 1948, Greenspun and one William Sosnow approached of the Universal Aircraft Salvage Corporation in Cahu, Hawaii. Greenspun represented Haganah, the Jewish organization and wanted to buy airplane engines and engine parts for use in Palestine. had been recommended to Greenspun as a person who was interested in assisting Haganah in furnishing military aid. gave Greenspun forty-two airplane b70 engines and also permission to take airplane engine parts. Greenspun, assisted by employees of did the packing. It was reported had quantities of machine guns and machine gun parts on his premises, reportedly removed by the Navy from deactivated airplanes and left there; and that made some of these available to Greenspun. An employee of the Universal Aircraft Salvage Corporation, advised in January, 1949, that early in 1948 he had helped Greenspun and Sosnow He said the guns had pack airplane machine guns on instructions been left on the premises by the Navy. He also said he saw Greenspun and Sosnow "steal at least 500" machine gun barrels from a Navy dump adjacent to Universal, and that these together with the machine guns from packed in airplane engine boxes, and hauled by a trucker to the docks for shipment to the Los Angeles harbor. At Wilmington. Calif. Greenspun chartered a boat, the Idalia, to take the machine guns to Mexico. property of claimed Greenspun forced him to accept the cargo and that when he refused, Greenspun threatened him with a revolver. The arms were unloaded in Mexico in the presence of several Mexican officers. Greenspun was part of the crew on the voyage. Information was received, however, that receptive to the deal; was paid for the use of his boat; and that there was no evidence that force was used to gain his assistance.

C O P Y No export license for the armament was obtained from the United States State Department. Although not specifically traced, the machine guns were reportedly reshipped from Mexico to Israel.

On September 28, 1949, Greenspun and six individuals associated in the shipping of the machine guns were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in Los Angeles, Calif. for conspiring to violate the Neutrality Act and the Export Control Law, Title 50, USC, Section 701 as amended, and Title 22, USC, Section 452, and Presidential Proclamation 2776, Categories One and Three, which became effective April 15, 1948. This count listed thirteen overt acts in furtherance of conspiracy. Count two charged Greenspun and three others of

the defendants with unlawfully exporting the armanents in violation of Section 452, Title 22, USC, and Section 701, Title 50, USC. The remaining defendants were charged with aiding and abetting.

On October 4, 1949, Greenspur surrendered himself in Los Angeles and was released on bond. He entered a plea of not guilty on February 20, 1950.

On April 12, 1950, and April 1950, the facts were re-presented to the Grand Jury and Greenspun was re-indicted, Criminal Docket number 21266. This indictment eliminated one defendant and also eliminated the charges of violating the Export Control Act.

On April 25, 1950, on motion of the Government, the idictments were dismissed as to all except Greenspun, Lawrence C. Ives, and Lloyd I. Rosenblum.

Trial of the case began July 6, 1950, at Los Angeles. On July 10, 1950, Greenspun changed his plea and entered a plea of guilty to the charge of conspiring to violate the Neutrality Act. On July 17, 1950, he was sentenced to pay a \$10,000 fine which was paid by him July 24, 1950. The Substantive charge was dismissed, and all charges against the remaining defendants were also dismis sed.

The Los Angeles Daily News, issue of October 27, 1949, contained a picture of Herman Greenspun, the accompanying article reporting his being free on bail following charges that "he masterminded a two million dollar gunsmuggling ring for Israel during that country's war with the Arab states." Greenspun was quoted as stating, "I have done nothing I'm ashamed of and I am sure I can clear myself in a court trial".

It was reported that in July, 1948, three payments totaling \$1,300,000 were made to Herman Greenspun through the Banco del Ahorro Macional, Mexico City, by cabled order of one Dr. Erwin Hayman, Geneva, Switzerland. Mr. Erwin Hayman of Geneva, Switzerland, was reportedly an officer of a firm which procured war materials for Israel.

It was further reported by a source of unknown reliability that in Mexico, Greenspun and an associate, reportedly involved on behalf of Haganah in the purchase and sale of arms, received a 10% "kick back" of the gross amount involved in an unidentified arms deal.

In January, 1949, information was received that Greenspun and his immediate followers had become pretty well discredited with Haganah and were at that time working for and using funds of the Irgun faction of the Israelite state. The Irgun faction was reported by this source as an extreme Leftist group.

III. ASSOCIATES AND ACQUAINTANCES

Records of the Second Judicial Department, Appellate Division, New York Supreme Court, reflect that Greenspun was examined in Albany, New York, in October, 1936, for admission to the Bar. Admission at that time was denied Greenspun because the examiners charged there had been irregularities in the taking of the examination. More specifically, a notation bears the remarks that information was passed by Greenspun and others during the course of the examination. For this reason, the Board of Examiners refused his admission and denied his right of again taking the examination for a period of two years.

In October, 1936, at the request of Judge Pinto (believed to be Michael F. Pinto and Vito Marcantonio), the State Board permitted Greenspun 37 to take a new examination. He was admitted to practice on November 17, 1947. These records also indicate Greenspun served his clerkship in the office of Pinto and Marcantonio.

The Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory for 1952, covering Albany and New York City, NY, fails to reflect any reference to Herman Greenspun.

Information was received in March, 1952, that Greenspun is presently operating the Las Vegas Morning Sun and is apparently the sole owner of this newspaper. There has been no indication that Greenspun has any gambler or hoodlum associates in connection with this newspaper nor is there any indication of financial backing from these sources.

Concerning Greenspun's activity in the Desert Inn, a las Vegas hotel and gambling casino bearing Wilbur Clark's name, it has been reported that Greenspun was retained by Clark as a publicity man during the early construction of the hotel with a promise of becoming Publicity Director when the hotel was completed. Greenspun reportedly made some money available to Clark when Clark was short of funds and thereby Greenspun acquired ownership of part of the motel and twenty-two shares of hotel stock. Clark subsequently became associated with a group of Cleveland underworld characters headed by Morris Kleinman and Moe Dalitz, and this group later took over financial control of the hotel. Greenspun resigned as Publicity Director, but it is believed he retained his financial interest in the Desert Inn.

Part Ten, Page 55, of the Hearings before the Special Committee to Investigate Organized Crime in Interstate Commerce, held in Nevada-Calif. in November, 1950, to March, 1951, reflects the testimony of Wilbur Ivern Clark, Las Vegas, Nevada. In response to questions concerning the Desert Inn Hotel, Las Vegas, Clark testified that he knew Greenspun that Greenspun owned one per cent of the Desert Inn Hotel, in addition to 30 per cent ownership of the motel part of this hotel.

Moe Sedway, Vice President, Flamingo Hotel, also testified before the above committee. During his testimony, he stated he was acquainted with Greenspun and further revealed that he, Sedway, had been a long-time acquaintance of Frank Costello, Frank Erickson, and "Longie" Zwillman, all of whom are well known in underworld circles.

AN In indictment was returned by a Federal Grand Jury in Miami, Florida, on November 16, 1948, charging nine individuals with the Foundry Associates, Inc. with conspiracy to violate the Neutrality Act, by conspiring to illegally export three B-17 bomber-type airplanes from Miami, Florida, to Zatec, Czechoslovakia, on June 11, 1948. These nine individuals included Adolph W. Schwimmer, Abraham J. Levin, William Sosnow, Charles Winters, Irwin Schindler, Ervin L. Johnson, Michael Kane, Leon Gardner, and Leonard Burns. These indictments did not include Herman Greenspun inasmuch as he was not involved in this specific alleged violation. However, it is noted that Greenspun was associated with the members of Foundry Associates, Inc. as indicated in Part IIA above. A highly confidential source and his associates were exerting b7D advised on November 24, 1948, that pressure on a high political level to influence prosecution in this Miami case. Informant advised that on December 14, 1948, conferred concerning efforts to influence this prosecution. In February, 1949, according to this informant, conferred in this respect.

The records of the United States District Court, Miami, Fla. under Docket #7280, reflects the dispostion of these indictments. On Pebruary 4, 1949, Charles Winters was sentenced at Miami, Florida, to serve eighteen months and to pay a fine of \$2,500. On February 16, 1949, the case against Irwin Schindler was transferred to New York. On March 8, 1950, the cases against Abraham Levin and William Sosnow were transferred to Los Angeles, Calif. On July 17, 1950, Levin and Sosnow on pleas of guilty were sentenced at Los Angeles to pay a fine of \$10,000 each. The cases against Adolph W. Schwimmer and Leon Gardner were Nolle Prossed on July 2, 1950. On June 28, 1951, the capiases against Ervin L. Johnson, Michael Kane, and Leonard Burns were returned unexecuted inasmuch as these individuals were not located.

FINANCIAL BACKGROUND

In connection with Greenspun's receiving from the RFC certain buildings which had been constructed under an RFC loan, inquiry was made into his financial status. The Las Vegas Bank confirmed certain statements he had made as to his net worth, while at the same time frankly stating that he had on occasion borrowed money in amounts up to \$5,000 and presently owed a note. However, the RFC accepted the Dun and Bradstreet rating of "unclassified".

This is broken down into the following: Newspeper - \$160,000. A thirty percent interest (\$250,000) in the Desert Inn Annex. A small interest of \$40,000 in the Desert Inn. Rupert Plumbing and Heating Co. -- balance. At the present time, Greenspun owes the RFC \$58,880. This is the result of the transaction whereby Greenspun bought Rupert Plumbing and Heating Co. and assumed all obligations of that company. Rupert had borrowed \$100,000 from RFC to build a building in Las Vegas. Part or all of this building now houses the Las Vegas Sun newspaper plant. This loan is current and is being paid, as of March 1, 1952.

Re financial condition of newspaper - it appears that Greenspun may have for some time been losing approximately \$2,000 per month on the operation of the Las Vegas Sun. It has been through his income as part owner of the Desert Inn that he has managed to keep the paper alive. He is also supposed to be getting occasional hand-outs from "angles" or friends who became ingratiated to him by his arms-running activities, or are connections in New York.

It is understood that the International Typographical Union holds a mortgage of approximately \$60,000 on the newspaper.

Attempts have been made to buy the newspaper, but all indications are that Greenspun won't sell and that money is not his object.



McCarthy has been showered with greenbacks from well-wishers; he has collected fabulous contributions from right-wing millionaires; he extorted from the taxpayers the largest appropriation ever spent on a Congressional investigation. All this money was supposedly invested to help him hunt Communists. He was armed with subpoena power, deluged with tips and leads. Yet, after four years of investigating, he hasn't come up with a single new Communist.

But if McCarthy has done the Communists no real harm, has he helped their cause? He has been undermining the democratic processes and subverting American values. Does this help Communism? He has been stirring neighbor against neighbor, sowing seeds of suspicion,

spreading confusion and hysteria.

Has he played into Communist hands? The Communist strategy, as any expert can tell you, is to divide and conquer. They hope to inflame labor against capital, Jew against Gentile, Protestant against Catholic, white against black. They preach hate and fear and suspicion. Their blueprint for revolution is to disorganize the populace, paralyze the government; then take over with a strongdisciplined minority.

The Communists do a lot of shouting, just like Mc-Carthy, They shout about civil rights, about the downtrodden Negro, about slum clearance. But there are no civil rights in Russia; they don't care about the Negro except to use him; and they secretly delight in slums, which are the cesspools of Communism. Likewise the Commu--nists shout against McCarthy, but they are no more sincerely anti-McCarthy than they are sincerely pro-civil

rights.

Herbert Philbrick, the FBI counter-spy who rose higher in the Communist party than did Whitaker Chambers, Louis Budenz, Elizabeth Bentley, among other, has this to say about McCarthy: "According to leaders of the Communist Party, McCarthy has helped them a great deal. The kind of attacks he has made do three things the comrades like. They add greatly to the confusion, putting up a smoke screen for the party and making it more dif-ficult than ever for people to discern just who is a Communist and who is not; they make the Party appear a lot stronger than it is; and they do considerable damage to some of the stupid liberals whom the party hates."

Who has benefitted more than the Communists from McCarthy's attacks on the State Department? on the Army? the Voice of America? Is it only coincidence that McCarthy has heaped his strongest abuse upon the same men the Kremlin wished to discredit? — such leaders as General George Marshall, who bolstered Western Europe against Communism; ex-Secretary of State Dean Acheson, whom diplomats regarded as the greatest anti-Communist brain; Phillip Jessup, who made such a fool of Andrei Vishinsky at the United Nations that the Kremlin called him back to Moscow until McCarthy blocked Jessup's re-appointment in the Senate. McCarthy also organized a smear campaign against General Douglas MacArthur and General Dwight Eisenhower until it became politically unpopular to keep it up.

Eric Sevareid, brilliant commentator and reporter for the Columbia throadcasting System in a speech before the School of Journalism of the University of Minnesota, said: "For the uninftlated, let me give a couple of small but typical examples of how the McCarthys can use even the best of the daily press to do their work.

When, during McCarthy's assault of innuendo against Ambaseador Charles Bohlen, the press play began to go against him, he reached into his bag of tricks. He demanded — the headline word is always, "demanded," somehow — that Bohlen be subjected to a lie-detector test. Now, it was preposterously impos-sible that the administration, having nominated Bohlen, would subject its distinguished diplomat to any such indignity or that Bohlen would accept the indignity.

Every sensible reporter and editor in town knew this was just a McCarthy straw man, for headline purposes. Yet, as sober paper as the Washington Star gave an eight-column ha mer line to this so-called "demand," which of course spread the notion among those who "read as they run" that Charles Bohlen

Is Senator McCarthy really a secret Communist? The newspapers of the country are not playing fair with the American people. There is a great deal of information which many papers possess and which is not being printed so that the people might better be in a position to realize what is taking place in the country today.

I have just returned from the capital of the United States. Conditions in Washington, D. C. Indicate a definite and hurried trend toward totalitarian principles. The city is blanketed by fear. People speak in soft tones. They peer over their shoulders before expressing an opinion and government officials both high and low nervously look around the room before giving expression to to their thoughts for fear the room is bugged.

It is a mood of hysteria which now has the nation's capital in its grasp. The newspapers, with few exceptions, are woefully derelict in their plain duty to inform the citizens. The press is cowed. It, too, lives in fear.

The pall on freedom which has descended on the country can be traced to one man. The person who has done more to weaken the country's security against internal subversion by intimidation, blackmall and smears is the junior senator from the state of Wisconsin, Joseph McCarthy.

What is the strange hold which McCarthy has on government officials? Why does the newspaper industry almost to a man, fear him? Why does the Gallup poll show him to be steadily rising in popularity? Who is McCarthy?

Senator McCarthy is really a secret Communist! From out of his past, the whisper has risen like a shost to haunt him. When I first heard it in Washington, I thought it too incredible to be true. I knew he was a sadist and a pervert and if I had only stopped to think, the answer should have been, and why not a Communist?

McCarthy has been operating through a defense mechanism caused by a guilt complex. When McCarthy started on his first large publicity campaign, he uttered charge that the State Department was honeycombed with homosexuals. According to the senator from Wisconsin, perverts were security risks because of their susceptibility to blackmail through fear of exposure.

I always thought that McCarthy "protesteth to much" and a search of the pest disclosed that he to was a homosexual. His tactics became clear. By leading a supposed fight against perverts in government, he could avert suspicion from himself. For anyone to say that McCarthy is a sex deviate, would bring an instant retort (ridiculous, he is the foremost fighter against perverts." And yet, the plain unvarnished truth is that Mo Carthy, by his own admission is a security risk on the

grounds of homosexuality. His next big campaign was against Reds in Government. Another phase of a defense mechanism operating through a guilt complex. And yet, the hottest rumor in Washington is that McCarthy was a Red and for all we know, might still be a secret Communist. I got the story,

the hottest story in the country and here it is:

The records show that the Committee set during the week when this testimony was brought out. All records of the committee were preserved except the transcript for the day when Levitt made the charges.

It is not too difficult to imagine what happened to this amazing testimony since Pat McCarran and Joe McCarthy are button hole buddles. But the important question is not so much who hushed up the story, but is it true? Was Albert Levitt telling the truth under oath?

"I feel that we, here in New York, owe BARRY GRAY, and the WMCA radio station (BILL STRAUSS) a vote of thanks for publicising these articles; he appears to have been the first one to have called the attention of New Yorkers to your set of articles, and your courage in talking right out without any fear, against MC CARTHY.

"The sermon came as a thunderbolt from out of a clear sky; nobody, present at the service, had ever imagined such a thing; people crowded around the preacher after the service, challenging him; crowds gathered cutside the church, much excited, denouncing the sermon as propaganda, and an unwarranted attack on MC CARTHY. But DR. JACK stood by the record which he had presented in his sermon. The audience left, simply flabbergasted.

"Now comes your series of articles confirming much of what is in that printed sermon, with one difference; DR. JACK could not disclose the "source" of his information, he told us, whereas in your articles, you mention "ALBERT LEVITT", a "confessed Ex-Communist", who, in "Aug. 19%1, squealing on his former associates, incriminated JOE MC CARTHY as an associate of Pinks. You add further that "the secret transcript" has been mysteriously removed from the committees! files"-presumably "LEVITT'S testimony" - and that "LEVITT himself has disappeared".

"It is my own conviction that the "pink" tendencies of the young NC CARTHY are less important at this time, than are some of the real issues of the day which are being beclouded by the red herring of "Communism", which, periodically, gets drawn across the American horizon. And for which MC CARTHY is being used as a front, at the present juncture in American history.

"In all the excitment about the Communists and the good (?) that MC CARTHY is doing in ferreting out subversives, we lose sight of the fact that much of the money behind MC CARTHY is, largely isolationist and that one object of this group, is to destroy the United Nations. One has only got to make a visit to the U. N. in New York, and talk to the people one meets there, to realize how true this is. For instance, one woman I spoke to from St. Louis, told me the U. N. "pelonged in Geneva"; another visitor from Texas, that the bldg., should be "turned into a Veterans! Hospital"; most of the visitors from the isolationist belt are obsessed with the idea that the United States is carrying the whole financial load for the U. N. When told, the per capita cost is 66¢ for the Americans, I generally got the reply, with a lift of the shoulders, "Its un-American" and "It will not succeed anyway". Generally, these people mentioned MC CARTHY as the person who is saving us from the Communists and eventually would save us from the U.N.

Because of this fact, I want again to express my appreciation for your courage in attacking the Senior senator from Wisconsin, in your series of articles, "Is Senator MC CARTHY really A Secret Communist?". I do not want the United Nations to fail.

It is not believed necessary that you discuss this information with Mr. Harold Kennedy, president of this association at this time. The letter is furnished for your personal information since you have been designated to attend the midwinter meeting of the Executive Board of this association to be held in Las Vegas, Nevada. You are reminded that the Bureau should be advised as soon as you learn of the date set for this meeting.

Bureau files reflect that Jack Streeter made allegations of FBI noncooperation at the New Orleans meeting of the National Association of County and Prosecuting Attorneys in 1953, when he was apparently referring to the Redfield Case involving robbery of an eccentric millionaire in which the Bureau investigated the Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property angle. Streeter was "set straight on the facts" and later he advised the chairman of the liaison committee of this association that relations between his office and the FBI were good. It is noted that his term expires in December 1954 but he is immature, has indicated political ambition and it is believed SAC Malone should be aware of this latest

contact in the event that Streeter may have discussed this with officers of this association or the liaison committee.

Mark Greenspun is Herman Milton Greenspun, publisher of the Las Vegas Sun, who has been the subject of two Mertrality act investigations conducted by the Bureau. He was found guilty of conspiracy and fined \$10,000 in the first case. The second case resulted in his acquittal. Greenspun has also been involved in several litigations against the late Senator Pat AcCarran. Ed Oneken is the city editor of the Las Vegas Sun. Mi Reid is a newspaper columist who has written numerous articles on orime and a book on "The Mafia."

Streeter has been correctly advised on Thream policy by Salt Take Sity and no further action is necessary there.
Baltimore being furnished copy since Anselm Sodaro, Prosecuting Attorney, Baltimore, is chairman of the TBI liaison committee of this association.

STREETER advised he was contacting the FBI thinking that possibly the FBI might desire to join forces with him and the persons in Las Vegas interested in this matter; he was then informed by SA McGEE that the matter appeared to be a local one and therefore we would not enter into it; he appeared to understand our position in that regard.

STREETER then said that he would appreciate having, on a confidential basis, information that the FBI has concerning GREENSPUN, and the above writers; particularly, he indicated, he was interested in details concerning the Neutraelity Act violation, not so much the cold and official record facts of the conviction, but details of the violation. Further, any information indicating any subversive connections, STREETER pointing out that he considers GREENSPUN's comments as to his neutraility act conviction as indicting disloyalty to this country. STREETER stated that he was not trying to put us on the spot; but wanted the information in the interests of taking whatever action against GREENSPUN that could be taken, and that he would use the information as leads from which his own information would be developed through other sources.

STREETER was then informed by SA McGEE of the Departmental policy involved, namely that Attorney General clearance is required as to giving information from our files, and STREETER advised that he realized our position. He also indicated he would contact whatever high official necessary in an effort to obtain clearance if clearance were possible. He did not say this in a demanding fasion, but rather appeared to be genuinely interested in doing everything he could to get information concerning GREENSPUN.

STREETER pointed out that at the District Attorney's national meeting an FBI representative had solicited cooperation and had indicated that District Attorney's requests for assistance would be considered.

It appeared to SA McGEE that STREETER would probably communicate with me or the Bureau in this matter, and so he informed STREETER that the matter would be referred to me.

In accordance with my instructions, STREETER was recontacted on November 12, 1954 by SA McGEE accompanied by SA and was informed that while we appreciate his interest in contacting us, we cannot become involved in any local politics or local controversial matters which are not within our jurisdiction. He was informed that requests for information from our files with respect to matters of an official nature involving the office and work of the District Attorney will receive every consideration, but

that his inquiry was not within that category and that we are precluded from furnishing any information from our files, as had been stated to him previously by SA McGEE. It was pointed out to him that the Eureau cannot become involved in a local controversy.

STREETER appeared to be understanding as to our position in the matter, but again indicated an intense desire to do something about GREENSPUN. He stated that he does not object to GREENSPUN's exposure of graft but is desirous of knowing whether GREENSPUN's motives are good, or whether his background would indicate something deeper than that. STREETER mentioned that the national District Attorneys' meeting is at Las Vegas in February, 1955, and that a Bureau representative usually attends; he suggested the possibility that that representative might check GREENSPUN's file and orally and off the record acquaint him and interested Las Vegas persons with GREENSPUN's background — that a mere statement that he was or was not sincere would suffice. STREETER was again informed that this would not be possible, and that as a matter of fact, the Bureau did not express opinions or conclusions to anyone, even to other government agencies for whom investigations are made.

It is SA McGEE's opinion that STREETER is not trying to embarrass the Bureau in this matter. STREETER has been a "crusader" type of District Attorney, and it is possible that he is sincere in his present efforts to do something about GREENSPUN.

The information herein is being furnished for the Bureau's information and no further action is being taken.



THE FIRING OF ED CORSI as assistant to Secretary Dulles on immigration shows two significant straws-in-the-wind in Washington. They are: Straw No. 1—Tom Dewey, for

years the closest man to Ike. is no longer close. Dewey put his old campaign manager, Herb Brownell in the cabinet; his press relations man, Jim Hagerty, on the White House staff; another associate, staff; another associate, Tom Stevens, on the White House staff; and a partner in his pros-pective law firm, John Harlan, on the Supreme court. But Ed Corsi, who was in Dewey's cabinet as industrial commissioner for 10 years, got

fired.

Straw No. 2-Dulles is still letting congressmen dictate his foreign policy. He doesn't call

the tune himself.

During Dulles' first 2 years in the State department he listened attentively to the threats of Sen. McCarthy. If McCarthy even whispered, Dulles bowed. McCarthy is hoarse today and few people are listening, but Dulles is still bowing to congressmen.

In Corsi's case it was Cong. rancis Walter, Democrat of Francis Walter, Democrat of Easton, Pa., with an indirect assist from Sen. McCarthy's pal, Scott McLeod. To appease Accarthy, Dulles 2 years ago

put McLeod in charge of se-curity and immigration. Three months ago Corsi was appointed over McLeod's head. And it was a neat double-play—a was a neat double-play—a smear leak from McLeod to Walter—that got Corsi fired.

CORSI IS NO FLY-BY-NIGHT coming to this Republican. Coming to this country at the age of 10, he served as commissioner of immigration under Herbert Hoover, ran as GOP candidate for mayor of New York, is one of New York's leading citizens. He does not deserve to be sacri-He does not deserve to be sacrificed.

Much more important than Corsi, however, is the principle—the Dulles policy of bowing to congressmen. Every time a congressman crooks a little finger, Dulles puts on an appeasement somersault.

Far more important Corsi is the peace of the world. And what John Foster Dulles is doing is letting congressmen dominate foreign policy in such a way as to upset the peace of the world.

For when Anthony Eden proposed that England would guarantee us in Formosa if the U.S. would not guarantee Quemoyprovided a plebiscite Matsu, were held on Formosa, Dulles immediately ran up to Capitol Hill to ask Sen. William Knowland of California if he had any Objections.

Dulles did not decide the Eden proposal on the basis of what was good for the American people and the peace of the world. He decided it on the basis of whether Sen. Knowland would cause him trouble.

Sen. Knowland did threaten trouble. He told Foster Dulles that if the British plebiscite idea adopted, he. Knowland, make a speech on the W45 would make a speech on the senate floor denouncing it. He knew, as everyone in the Far East knows, that Formosans hate Chiang Kai-shek, that his executives shot 60,000 of them in one of the most bloody massacres since the war; and that any plebiscite would go overwhelmingly against him.

So the Eden plan, aimed at getting the U.S. off a hot spot which might precipitate World War III, was vetoed-all because the Eisenhower administration bows to congressmen who threaten trouble.

If you publish a powerful magazine and are a noted author. you can afford to say what you want about Joe McCarthy. If you publish a small paper and are a minor author, you can't.

That's what Hank Greenspun, publisher of the Las Vegas Sun and author of a column, "Where I Stand," found out when he wrote over a year ago that Sen. McCarthy's stormy course would lead to death by assassination. Greenspum was promptly indicted on the order of Attorney General Brownell for encouraging assassination and goes to trial this week.

In contrast, author Ernest Hemingway wrote in Look Mag-azine: There is nothing wrong with Sen. McCarthy that a 577-gauge rifle won't cure."

This went much further than Greenspuniin inciting to assassination. However, Hemingway wrote this in a magazine owned by one of Ike's best friends, Gardner Gowles Jr., one of the said the fortune sident hoosters. early Ike-for-president boosters. Under the laws of criminal libel, the publisher of a magazine is just as liable as the man who writes in the magazine.

Cowles and Hemingway have not been prosecuted. Greenspun now goes to trial,

The file on me, sent by Eva Adams to Harvey Matusow, self-confessed false witness for the government and aide to Senator Joe McCarthy, If typical of all information in the files of the permanent investigation sub committee, is an astounding indictment of all Congressional probes and investigating committees.

Of course, a person like myself would never have been a subject for scrutiny by any investigating committee, except that I have been rather outspoken in my opinions on Senators McCarran and McCarthy. And as these two fourflushers were chairman of investigating committee; one during the Democratic Administration and the other during Republican tenure, naturally they spared no expense (government, that is) to try to prove anything derogastory against me.

I must be the purest man in the land to withstand five years fof intensive probing by the master probers in the country, withcout the establishment of any derogatory material whatsoever, except that I went AWOL "for one night covering" New year's eve in 1944-45. SUNSPOTS I N POLITICS

With fust a year to go before the 1956 campaign for United State Senate reaches its climax in Nevada, some clear decisions have already been made, and advance plans are in the works—on one side.

Perhaps the most significant development is the word passed down from Washington; Miss Eva Adams will not leave the

office of Senator Alan Bible as had been widely predicted. This is the signal to choose up sides.

After the death of Senator Pak McCarran last fall and his replacement by Bible, Nevada friends of Bible who were no friends of McCarvan, were quietly given the

word that Eva wasn't going to be around very long. They joy-fully spread this word as evidence that their man was no McCarran lackey — the unrefuted assertion made by Tom Mechling in 1952 that beat Bible in the primaries for the Senate that year.

But the wheels in McCarran's office in the Senate never missed a turn after Bible arrived. They kept on grinding out the same old stuff. The only difference was that McCarran's fearful influence was missing, and Eva, rather than Bible, tried to make up for this.

Her well-known tactics can be recognized in many ways here at home. Weak, misplaced Keith Lee will resign as State Chairman of the Democrats. Already the pitch is on for Grant Sawyer of Eiko to replace him at a meeting of the Central Committee in Fallon July 30. Sawyer is a fine upstanding young lawyer, but even more devoted to the creed of McCarran than was Lee, if possible. And the small county members of the Central Committee can be expected to rally around Sawyer.

Another straw in the wind is the bolstering of Bible's Las Vegas law office with Ralph Denton, also from Elko, another fine young lawyer, but equally dedicated to Eva and the memory of Senator Pat. Denton will shortly join Joe McDonald, Jr. here to help spread the word for Bible between now and next year's election.

All these are only preliminaries. The main event is still to come. The BIG EFFORT by Eva, Kingmaker Norman Biltz, Thunderbird Boss Marion Hicks and that rededicated Democrat, Al Cahlan, is to be the launching of a third daily newspaper in Las Vegas.

We at the Sun haven't yet seen the plans, but our cystal ball shows us competition coming in the morning field, amply financed and prepared to woo our advertisers with rates too low for a sound business venture.

This venture won't be solely aimed at helping Bible stay in the Senate next year. It will be carefully planned also to suck the life-blood from the Sun, and — its backers hope — restore the type of "safe thinking" in Clark County that made it easy to elect the men Al Cahlan supported before the Sun-rise.

With malice toward none, On December 29, 1952, a deposition was taken in Washington, D.C. Senator Pat McCarran was being questioned under oath regarding his role in the boycott of the Las Vegas Sun.

Toward the end of the hearing, the following question was put to Senator McCarran by his own attorney, William Leahy:

"Mr. Leahy; Senator, I want to ask you one question.

"Witness: Yes.
"Question: Isn't Mr. Green spun mistaken right this minute in thinking you have malice toward him?

"Answer: He certainly is, Mr.

I do not ordinarily question the veracity of a United States senator but the facts do not bear out the senator's sworn answer.

The following incident took place in October of 1952, two months before the deposition. Harvey Matusow was in Salf Lake City bearing false witness against one Clinton Jencks, who, I presume was some sort of an official of the Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers' Union. Pat McCarran was the Chairman of the Committee, which was conducting the hearings and listening to the lies of Mr. Matusow and, incidentally, believing them.

The following is taken from the book "False Witness" and Goesn't bear out the statement of Pat McCarran that he bore me no malice:

"A few days before the hearings ended, I received a call from Eva Adams, Senator McCarran's administrative assistant. She asked me to come to the Senator's suite. I was puzzled, McCarran was a busy and important man, What did he want with me?

"I knocked on his door. Eva Adams answered and ushered me in. There I saw, sitting erect in his chair, the graying, aging figure of Senator Pat McCarran. His voice showed intensity. He wanted something and apparently thought I could help him.

He was cordial as he asked me to sit down. He then began to hedge a bit, peering into space as he groped for words. He asked me if I knew Hank Greenspun, the editor and publisher of the Las Vegas Sun of Las Vegas, Nevada, McCarran said he thought Greenspun was a Communist or a Communist ronter. He wanted to know if I through my connections, could establish this fact, "I was elated at the thought of McCarran's coming to me for help and was over-eager as I accepted his invitation."

"McCarran was out for Greenspun's scalp because he threatened to topple McCarran's political empire. Greenspun had supported Thomas B. Mechling, an anti-McCarran senatorial candidate. Mechling had defeated McCarran's candidate, Alan Bible, in the primary.

"Greenspun also had a lawsuit pending against Senator McCarran for conspiring with the gambling casinos in Las Vegas to withdraw all their advertising from Greenspun's paper.

McCarran asked me to check with my contacts in New York on the chance that I might dig up something on Greenspun. I suggested to the senator that he furnish me with a list of all the employees of Greenspun's paper. My plan was to try to pin the "Communist label" on his staff.

"Greenspun was also having his difficulties with senator Mo-Carthy, McCarthy attacked him in Las Vegas, calling him a Communist, based on false information contained in a dossiler which I later received from Eva Adams. McCarthy told me that he attacked Greenspun because of Greenspun's outspoken anti-McCarthy and anti-McCarran editorial policy.

My meeting with McCarran also resulted in plans for my work in Nevada, McCarran wanted me to go into Nevada on behalf of Senator George W. Malone, who was the Republican candidate. McCarran, a Democrat, was so embittered toward the Democratic candidate, Thomas Mechling, that he supported Malone, the Republican.

"Eva Adams filled me in on the details. She told me whom to contact in Las Vegas and we discussed a general outline of work." days prior to the November election. My instructions included eavesdropping on the bartenders, card dealers and stickmen at the dice tables, to see if they were supporting McCarran's machine, which was supporting Malone. I also had a few rumors to spread. These jobs were not difficult for me, a professional investigator."

However, ignorance is bliss and I went on my merry way. But it surely is interesting, reading about it years late.

But to get back to my original question. How about the poor unfortunates who did not own a newspaper and could not fight back against the accusations of false witnesses and corrupt government officials?

Shouldn't something be done for them?

Greenspun was subject of two Neutrality Act investigations by Bureau. He was acquitted in one trial and received \$10,000 fine for separate offense in second trial on 7/17/50 after plea of guilty. Details of these offenses and dispositions are included in FCC memorandum. (In 1952, limited investigations were conducted concerning bribery allegation against Greenspun and possible perjury in a civil antitrust case involving Greenspun and advertisers in Las Vegas. Department advised facts did not constitute violation Federal statute. Extensive investigation conducted by Bureau, 1953, after his application for pardon after completion of sentence. Pertinent information developed is contained in blank memorandum to be given FCC. DETAILS

BACKGROUND:

Mr. J. Walter Yeagley, Acting Assistant Attorney General, Internal Security Division, forwarded a copy of a letter dated September 10, 1956, with an enclosed seven-page memorandum concerning Greenspun which George C. McConnaughey, Chairman of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) forwarded to the Attorney General. Mr. McConnaughey advised that an application is pending before the FCC for a transfer of television station KLAS-TV, Las Vegas, to Greenspun. Consideration is given to the character qualifications of such an applicant. McConnaughey points out the enclosed memorandum contains derogatory information, the source of which is not known. McConnaughey desires that the files of the FBI be searched to corroborate or refute the matters set forth in the memorandum and that additional pertinent information also be furnished.

Yeagley requested that the FBI furnish directly to McConnaughey whatever information was deemed appropriate concerning Greenspun.

A review of the memorandum furnished by the FCC reveals that up to the final portion dealing with financial background, it is substantially a copy of a memorandum dated April 2, 1952, furnished by Mr. Nichols to the late Senator McCarran with the approval of Deputy Attorney General A. Devitt Vanech. (62-97007-10X) Similar information was also furnished by a memorandum from the Director dated July 22, 1952, to Mr. Vanech. (62-97007-23)

The memorandum concerning Greenspun furnished by the FCC is identical to a copy of a memorandum forwarded to the Bureau by the Salt Lake City Office on May 7, 1953. (62-97007-105) The document furnished to the Salt Lake City Office is a carbon copy and was loaned to an Agent at Las Vegas by William Peccole, City Commissioner of Las Vegas, for review. Apparently wide circulation had been given that document. It is noted that on November 14, 1952, Greenspun contacted an Agent at Las Vegas and stated every newspaper in Nevada except his own had an FBI file on him and he demanded a copy. He was told this was not true and the matter was dropped. (62-97007-93)

Jones to Nichols Memorandum

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Greenspun was the subject of two Neutrality Act investigations by the Bureau. (2-875 and 2-1004) On February 6, 1950, in Federal Court in Los Angeles, Greenspun was acquitted of the first offense. On the second offense, after a change to a plea of guilty to the charge of conspiracy to violate the Neutrality Act, Greenspun was sentenced to pay a \$10,000 fine on July 17, 1950. The details of these offenses were included in the memorandum furnished by the FCC.

A limited investigation was conducted in 1952 concerning a bribery allegation against Greenspun that he offered \$25,000 to get a case against him fixed. An inquiry was also conducted concerning possible perjury in a civil antitrust case involving Greenspun and advertisers in the Las Vegas area.


advised the Bureau on March 25, 1953, that the perjury and bribery matters had been carefully studied in the Criminal Division, and it was determined that the facts and evidence did not disclose an offense violative of existing Federal criminal statutes. (62-97007-102)

In 1953, the Bureau conducted an extensive investigation re Greenspun following his application for pardon after completion of sentence. The pertinent information developed has been set out for the information of the FCC.

It was reported that Greenspun in April, 1953, was being sued for be libel by one Las Vegas City Commissioner. Greenspun becallegedly printed charges in his newspaper on four different occasions that Peccole was dishonest and had used his public office for personal gain. (62-97007-104)

Greenspun was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury at Las Vegas, Nevada, on 4/8/54 on charges of violating Section 1461, Title 18, U. S. Code, in that Greenspun, in a column written by him on 1/8/54, sent out indecent matter in the mail which tended to incite murder or assassination of Senator Joseph McCarthy. This article read in part as follows: "Live by the sword and you die by the sword! Destroy people and they in turn must destroy you! The chances are that McCarthy will eventually be laid to rest at the hand of some poor slob whose life and reputation he has destroyed through his well-established smear technique. The poor victim will feel he has little to live for, so he will get a gun and blast Joe to Hades. It might be a bit messy but Joe is used to messiness.





He has created enough of it." (62-97007-122) Greenspun, after trial, was acquitted of this charge. The only Bureau interest in that case was the conducting of a jury panel investigation, and the substantive case was investigated in its entirety by the Post Office Department. (51-417)

Bufiles contain numerous references to Greenspun in the Crime Survey reports. This data has not been verified by investigation. Also a portion has come from highly confidential sources.

OBSERVATIONS:

Greenspun has an extremely unsavory background, including scurrilous attacks questioning the loyalty of the Director himself. Undoubtedly, there will be a hearing by the FCC, and Greenspun will utilize any technique available to divert attention from his own shortcomings. It appears that there has been widespread dissemination of the information furnished McCarran. Greenspun will likely make public accusations that the FBI has circulated information concerning him.

It is felt that only that additional pertinent information contained in Bufiles which is the result of actual investigation by the FBI should be furnished to the FCC at this time. The attached memo to Assistant Attorney General Yeagley contains an enclosed blank memorandum setting forth such information plus a copy of Greenspun's Identification Record. The memo to Mr. Yeagley also advises that the memo forwarded by the FCC has been verified except for that portion dealing with "Financial Background." In view of the possible repercussions which may follow, it is felt best to reply to Yeagley rather than directly to the FCC.

The speech had tremendous impact upon his listeners, and because of its significance is being reprinted here, in condensed form, as a service to our readers.

A Free And Living Press By EE MORGAN

It has been truly said that the greatest struggle of our generation is for the minds of men. Beyond all reasonable doubt, there has never been in the history of mankind a challenge to nations, and particularly to our nation, as that which exists today.

From time immemorial, it is believed fair to say, the ascendancy of peoples and nations has been related largely to the power, economic and military, of those nations. These

cant, have ceased to have the overriding considerations of paramount significance which once obtained. That this is true is the result of the simple fact that mankind, whether for good or evil, has at length tapped the well springs of creation and brought into being an ultimate weapon of warfare the atomic and hydrogen bombs.

History will record, I believe, that the advent of this uitimate weapon marked the emergence of man as a truly intellectual being. Henceforth his decisions and consummations of his aspirations and fears will not be resolved on the battlefields of the world, but through the effectiveness

of his appeals to and his control over his fellow men. Indeed, it cannot be doubted that despite the ostensible confusion in the world today and the bellicose utterances from time to time, we realize, as must our most formidable adversary, the Soviet Union, that victory will be determined largely and essentially to the extent that the imagination and minds of the peoples of the world are influenced.

I make these prefatory observations tonight because you hold within your hands the most conclusive and effective instrument for mass communication in all the world ropress. In your hands rests the sacred duty of presenting interpreting for our people the march of world events and the fundamental verities thereof. This is an obligation which no member of your profession may assume lightly. It is an obligation the implications of which go deep into the well springs of our national origin and fundamental tenets as a free people. It is an obligation which we may well explore in this hour of reflection in its development and significance.



We easily and lightly refer to a free press, and yet how many of us this night, if called upon, could truly and definitely state what we mean by a free press? Moreover, how many of us are prepared to say that in our own area of endeafor we have presented truly a free and living press in the American tradition. Let us reflect for a moment upon the subject.

For several centuries after the invention of the printing press, printing was regarded as a privilege which could be pursued only by grant of the sovereign. Not only was publication made the subject of license, but also the number of printers was usually limited. Indeed, it was not always true

that our own press could be characterized as free.

when, on March 4, 1789, the Constitution of the United States went into effect, there was not one word therein containing guarantees with respect to freedom of the press of any other of the fundamental rights which we cherish. It was not long however in coming, for the very first Congress framed and submitted for adoption the first ten amendments to the Bill of Rights, which were adopted in 1791. And the very first of these fundamental rights, as a companion to the freedom of religion, was the requirement that:

"Congress; shall make no law abridging the

And yet it must be recognized that our Constitution represents a compromise between highly divergent vewpoints and that at most it can be no more than a generalized framework within which the true incidents of our government and

society evolve through the inexorable experiences of time and circumstance. Indeed, it is this very generalization which doubtless inspired England's Gladstone to say:

The American Constitution is, so far as I can see, the most wonderful work ever struck off at a given time by the brain and purpose of man."

But does the guarantee of the First Amendment truly mean that we shall have in fact, or that we have in fact, a free press? Oh, certainly we can define freedom of the press as the right to publish without previous license or permission and without fear of punishment subject to such laws as those on ilibel, obscenity, sedition, and blasphemy. But does this

insure a truly free and living press?

I submit that a free press is only partially the result of the legal protection accorded it. And that fundamentally a free press—a living spirit in our midst—can only be the result of the dedication of you men and women who administer the press. This sense of dedication to your calling will determine whether the American press can wield the great infuence which it is called upon to exercise in the titanic struggle for the minds of men.

Just last week I had the good fortune to have dinner with the Bishop of Puerto Rico, a very learned Catholic churchman, who incidentally originally came from your neighboring state of Arizona. Recalling how Puerts Rico eight years ago was in a moribund state of economic collapse and despair, I inquired of the Bishop how it came to be today that Puerto

Rico literally lift themselves by their own bootstraps and that by the sheer will of its inhabitants has coined the expression "operation bootstrap," by which the people of Puerto Rico litterally lift themselves by their own bootstraps and are determined to build a better life. The reply of the Bishop was simple: "I believe it is all the result of a sense of dedication on the part of our officials and our people."

To me, in the ultimate analysis, that observation spells a criterion by which all of us can be judged in determining whether we are making the contribution which our country is properly entitled to expect of us at this critical stage of world events. I have not the slightest doubt that if all of us here tonight would experience a rededication to upholding the meaning and spirit of a free and living press, little short of a miracle would result.

The other evening I had occasion to read the words of William Blackstone, whose commentaries are today still the finest expression of the origins of our law. Here is what he

said concerning liberty of the press:

"The liberty of the press is indeed essential to the nature of a free state; but this consists in laying no previous restraints upon publications, and not in freedom from censure for criminal matter when published. Every free man has an undoubted right to lay what sentiments he pleases before the public; to forbid this, is to destroy the freedom of the press; but if he publishes what is improper, mischievous, or illegal, he must take the consequences of his own temerity. To subject the press to the restrictive power of a licenser, as was formerly done, both before and since the revolution, is to subject all freedom of sentiment to the prejudices of one man, and make him the arbitrary and infallible judge of all controverted points in learning, religion, and government. But to punish (as the law does at present) any dangerous or offensive writings, which, when published, shall on a fair and improper trial be adjudged of a pernicious tendency, if necessary for the preservation of peace and good order, of government and religion, the only solid foundations of civil liberty. Thus the will of individuals is still left free; the abuse only of that free-will is the object of legal punishment. Neither is any restraint hereby laid upon freedom of thought or enquiry: liberty of private sentiments is still left; the disseminating, or making public, of bad sentiments, destructive of the ends of society, is the crime which society corrects. A man may be allowed to keep poisons in his closet, but not publicly vend them as cordials. And to this we may add, that the only plausible argument heretofore used for the restraining the just freedom of the press, that it was necessary to prevent the daily abuse of it, will entirely lose its force, when it is shown (by a seasonable exertion of the laws) that the press cannot be abused to any bad purpose, without incurring a suitable punishment: whereas it never can be used to any good one, when under the control of an inspector. So true it will be found, that to censure the licentiousness, is to maintain the liberty of the press."

Reflecting upon the words of this learned sage of our law, two thoughts are paramount: (1) Liberty of the press is indeed essential to the nature of a free state; and (2) No restrictions shall be imposed upon the press save to prevent a destruction of the ends of society. It can thus be seen that historically the press is endowed with a duty to preserve

free society.

In discharging this duty, we can have no surer guide than the well-worn adage — "The truth shall make us free." When the press departs from this single objective to present the truth, it has falled in its historic mission and has prostituted its excuse for being. When the press is used for personal, selfish, and ulterior purposes, it defiles the memories of the brave and courageous men who, at the expense of life, property, and reputation, stood firmly against oppression in order that the concept of a free and living press might see the light of day.

Yes, I believe we need a sense of dedication or perhaps more clearly stated, a sense of rededication, a rededication to the precepts and principles of freedom and truth. For the struggle for freedom and truth shall be an unending one as ong as you and I shall live. And with the rise of each new morning's sun, we must again resolve to do each day the fundamental job of presenting and interpreting truth for our people. Perhaps this has never been better expressed than

in the words of Goethe, who said:

"Yes! To this thought I hold with firm persistence;
The last result of wisdom stamps it true;
He only earns his freedom and existence;
Who daily conquers them anew."



Greenspun, in a column in his newspaper dated 9-25-66, was most laudatory of the FBI and stated, in connection with the current wiretapping controversy in Las Vegas, that the FBI used these devices only at the order of the Department of Justice and possibly the Attorney General himself. He stated that the Las Vegas Office was acting under orders, that SAC Dean Elson of Las Vegas and other Agents are fine law enforcement officers but they must carry the burden because those in authority will not speak up."

Mr. Tolson has instructed that we/write Greenspun thanking him for his support, as evidenced in the above column, and setting forth in this letter information to attack Governor Grant Sawyer of Nevada. Governor Sawyer has, of course, 'called for state presecution of FBI Agents in Las Vegas on wiretapping charges and heals using his attacks on the FBI as an important political issue in his campaign for re-election.

BACKGROUND OF GREENSPUN:

Greenspun has an unsavory background which includes attacks questioning the loyalty of the Director. In 1956 the Federal Communications Commission, in connection with an application pending for transfer of a television station to Greenspun, furnished a 7-page memorandum to the Department containing derogatory information about Greenspun. Greenspun was the subject of two Neutrality Act investigations by the Bureau. He was acquitted in one trial and received a \$10,000 fine in a second trial on July 17, 1950, following a plea of guilty.

We also conducted an extensive investigation in 1953 following his application for pardon after completion of sentence. In addition, he was tried and negulited in 1954 on charges that he sent indecent material through the mail which tended to incite murder or assassination of the late Joseph McCarthy.

While data favorable to the PBI has appeared in the "Las Vegas Sun' infrequently in the past, Greenspun and his paper have generally been among our detractors and critics."

Greenspun in his newspaper on March 6, 1984, indicated that he had appeared on the 'Open End' television show and had stated that there was no organized crime direction of Nevada gambling.

An editorial in the "Las Vegas Sun' on November 9, 1935, cited the investigation of wiretapping and other investigative techniques being conducted by Senator Edward Long's Subcommittee. The editorial stated. Congress is properly concerned and must take the lead innealling a halt to illegal use of encoping devices by federal agencies. A Nevada law which prohibits similar actions by local agencies must be enforced as well." On December 17, 1985, Greenspun's paper editorialized, "Unsubstantiated charges of 'skimming' in the gambling industry don't accomplish anything except cast the state's reputation farther into shadow.... The danger is that the uniformed and misled may vote for something that will practically wipe out an industry that now supplies about 30 pergeent of the state's general fund revenues." The February 1, 1968, issue of the "Las Vegas Sun" again commented on Senator Long's Subcommittee and reported that Subcommittee Counsel Fensierwald had said he was "prepared to go ahead with hearings on FBI bugging in Las Vegas as soon as Long approves. The paper editorialized, "Allowing agents to use indiscriminated all the massive advances made in scientific machinery to invade the lives of citizens who may be merely suspected of wrongdoing smacks too much of the police state."

Sawyer and caesar's palace:

BACKGROUND:

By letter of 5-17-68, Greenspun wrote Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Harold Campbell of the Las Vegas Office, requesting him to prepare a guest piece to appear in the "Here I Stand" column of the "Sun" during June. Greenspun, who normally writes this column, will be vacationing in June and normally invites prominent civic personalities to contribute an article during his absence from the city.

The article would be of any subject in about 800 to 1,000 words, and Greenspun notes that "editing will be kept at a minimum."

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

During October, 1963, Greenspun made a similar request of SAC Elson, who was then assigned to the Las Vegas Office. It was then recommended and approved that we comply with that request and an appropriate article, prepared by the Crime Records Division, was furnished to the SAC in Las Vegas for this purpose. However, files disclose no evidence that the article appeared in the "Sun."

It will be recalled that Greenspun has a very unsavory background which includes newspaper attacks against the Director and the FBD. He has been the subject of a number of FBI investigations and in June, 1950, received a \$10,000 fine following his plea of guilty to a Neutrality Act violation. In 1953, when he applied for a pardon after completion of sentence, we conducted an extensive investigation which eventually resulted in his being granted a full and unconditional pardon. At this time the Director commented, "This rascal should never get a full pardon."

Although Greenspun and his newspaper were more frequently our detractors rather than our supporters, this situation has changed in recent years. During the wiretap controversy concerning organized criminal elements at Las Vegas, Greenspun published a letter from the Director in Octoberr, 1966, which clearly established that any utilization of electronic listening devices by the FBI had been done only with the full knowledge and authority of the Attorney General. Publication of this letter created considerable publicity throughout the country and spurred the then incumbent Governor Grant Sawyer to publicity, attack the FBI for violating Nevada wiretap laws. It is said that Sawyer's position ultimately led to his defeat for reelection.

Since that time, Greenspun and the "Sun" have been very favorable in their comments concerning their publicity of the FBI.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That, if approved, your office (Mr. Bishop's) inform SAC Campbell to advise Greenspun that he will prepare the requested article.

2. That the Crime Records Division prepare an appropriate article which will be submitted for approval for use by the SAC, Las Vegas, in connection with Greenspun's request.

In February 1972, Gay recalls that Ralph H. Winte, Director of Internal Systems and Services Audit, Post Office Box 309, Las Vegas, Nevada, who is directly responsible to Gay, telephonically contacted him at his Encino office. Gay recalls that Winte advised him that Winte had met with E. Howard Hunt and another unknown individual at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel, 9500 Wilshire Boulevard, Beverly Hills, California, in early February 1972. Hunt advised Winte that both he and the other individual were members of the Committee to Re-Elect the President, and consequently, were contacting Winte concerning a project that would be both beneficial to the Committee to Re-Elect the President and the Summa Corporation (formerly Hughes Tool Company). went on to state that Winte related to him that Hunt proposed a plan wherein Hunt and others (unnamed) would "go into the Greenspun's safe" at Greenspun's office in Las Vegas, Nevada, and take papers and documents that were of interest to the Committee to Re-Elect the President and other documents relating to Howard Hughes.

Gay advised that at this point Winte asked him if he was interested in the project. Gay stated that he was completely opposed to the plan that was proposed by Hunt to Winte and that Winte was relating to him. Gay instructed Winte to contact Hunt and advise him that they, the Summa Corporation, had no interest in the project.

Gay was asked if he discussed this proposal with any other individuals. Gay recalled that he may have contacted Corporate Counsel Chester Davis of the New York
MENDER Law Firm of Davis and Cox. Gay further pointed out that
the Cox of the firm Davis and Cox, is Maxwell Cox, brother of Special Prosecutor Archibald Cox. Gay further went on D.C. to state that the west coast representative of the Davis, and Cox firm is D. Martin Cook, who has offices at Century City, Los Angeles, California. Gay was asked if he had ever been contacted by Maurice Stans or Herbert W. Kalmbach, or any of their representatives on the Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President. Gay stated that he has not been contacted by any of those individuals. Gay states that he has not made any contributions to the 1972 Presidential Campaign. He further advised that the Summa Corporation has a contribution committee which has as its chairman Nadine Henley, who decides where contributions go. Gay advised that he has never contributed to the contribution committee and he believes that the only contributor is Howard Hughes. Gay recalls that Summa Corporation retains a Washington, D. C. lobbyist by the name of Boby Bennett who handles delicate matters pertaining to contributions in the Washington, D. G. area. Gay states that Bennett is an "old Salt Lake boy" and believes that Bennett is completely hopest. completely honest. Gay recalls that Bennett may have contacted him pertaining to donations, however, he believes that he may have directed Bennett to Nadine Henley and the contributions committee.

Gay advised that Ralph F. Winte reports directly to him and as such Winte's title is Director of Internal

Systems and Service Audit. Gay states that Winte's responsibilities are to maintain hotel and casino security in the Las Vegas, Nevada, enterprises. By that, Gay said he meant Mafia activities and individuals who would cheat at the gambling operations. In addition, Winte was responsible for internal security of the Summa Corporation. Gay states that Winte has authority to hire and fire individuals in his security and service division.

Gay states that he has never met James McCord, nor does he have any information that McCord was ever offered employment by the Summa Corporation.

Gay states that he has never metnor has conducted any business whatsoever with E. Howard Hunt, G. Gordon Liddy, or James Walter McCord.

Gay was shown six black and white photographs in which the photograph depicting James Walter McCord, among others, was displayed. Gay was asked to look over the photographs and to select any photograph in which the individual pictured was known to him.

Gay looked over the photographs and stated that none of the individuals depicted in those photographs was known to him; however, Gay pointed to the photograph of McCord and stated that he believes that this is the individual whose picture he had seen in the news media.

Gay was shown six black and white photographs in which the photographs depicting E. Howard Hunt and G. Gordon Liddy were displayed. Gay was asked to look over the photographs and to select any photograph in which the individual pictured was known to him.

Gay looked over the photographs and stated that none of the individuals depicted in those photographs was known to him.

Reference is made to Las Vegas teletype to the Bureau dated 12/8/70. Concerning information set forth therein relative to Ed Morgan, Washington, D. C., attorney, SAC Campbell, Las Vegas, was telephonically advised today that he should be careful in his dealings with Morgan as he is no friend of the FBI.

SAC Campbell was most appreciative of the call and advised he had been careful in any dealings he has had with Morgan in the past. He added that Morgan has for some time been representing Hank Greenspun, publisher of "The Las Vegas Sun." He stated Greenspun has on a number of occasions been active in real estate matters where the Hughes' interests were involved. SAC Campbell also advised that Morgan, on occasion, has represented the Maheu faction of the Hughes' interests in several matters which have arisen. He stated he was not familiar with the ramifications or details of these transactions.

SAC Campbell said no new developments or information have come to the attention of the Las Vegas Office concerning Hughes.
